Correct. Number of residents in our city.

JUST two high-impact examples that affect everything from potholes to PPE. Councilperson Brantley has been working as our Census liaison and you've seen her posts and emails. You may have gotten my robocall. We will continue to spread the word and emphasize the critical importance of completing this simple task.
